Her father and another brother immigrated next and then Edith and the rest of the family came to the US and Des Moines when she was 12. She speaks of the various family businesses, primarily Sherman Paper Company along with shoe, jewelry and grocery stores. She talks of her marriage, children, education, inter-faith marriages, her sister Dorothy active in Hadassah, and her children's education and careers. Clearly, she enjoyed the non-Jewish community.
